Dear Mr President:

I am concerned about baby formula. Nestle was my first boycott in response to their appalling campaign to turn a modest part of their profits by marketing baby formula to some of the world's poorest despite the knowledge that thousands of babies would die and many more grow up malnourished as a direct result. Many of these injuries from the 70s and 80s remain with us though the profits have long been spent. Today this combination of dehumanizing poor foreigners while idolizing quick profits has returned baby formula to the news. The Secretary of Health and Human Services, along with his total lack of preparation for snatching babies at the border has shocked the world by opposing a UNWHA resolution to support breast feeding. My government backing modest corporate profits over babies lives was repulsive but also striking was the vindictive intensity of the attack bringing in economic threats to Ecuador and only giving in when the Russians - your sponsors - stepped up.

Please assure me that you will fire Secretary Azar.

I am very proud to be a US resident and a large part of that derives from our support for human rights.
