Dear Ms Lee:

I am concerned about immigration. Residency law needs to be aligned with current realities. With reactionaries in power it will be difficult to pass anything but Democrats need to shift the debate by suggesting something to address the current Central American crisis with its mix of family ties, brutal gang persecution, minimal governmental protections and economic instability. Immigration is a great boon to this country, enriching the food and culture while driving down crime and shifting our aging demographics. Immigrants also start more companies with studies showing that childhood arrivals (such as the DACA recipients and those being viciously traumatized at the border) are particularly successful.
