Dear Mr President:

I am concerned about selective prosecution. The rule of law requires reasonably uniform application of justice. Presently the DOJ is failing around immigration with vicious prosecution of minor offenses, excusing terrible treatment by decades old minor convictions and trolling through thousands of forms looking for minor errors all while pushing quotas on judges to increase convictions rather than justice. The DOJ is also failing around gun laws even though Attorney General Sessions identified this failing in March there remains essentially no enforcement of accuracy on background check form 4473. The worst failing of justice might be around corruption where you have threatened and complained to shut down investigations of the shocking corruption throughout your administration. This was highlighted by a recent Republican spreadsheet outlining the many corruption cases a Democratic congress might reasonably investigate.
