Dear Mr President:

I am concerned about human rights. Congressional inaction has left immigration policy to the executive which has worked only to the extent that the President has acted decently but as Mr Cohen emphasized this week you are not decent. Your immoral attacks on immigrants have been the clearest policy resulting from this failing but even you eventually rescinded last year's appalling child separation policy. Unfortunately, you have not yet acted to mitigate the terrible harms this policy produced. Recent reports find rampant sexual assault in the facilities to which these children were shunted. Just last week your administration again argued before Judge Sabraw that the incompetence is so extreme that even finding all the separated children would be impossible. The House has also opened hearings but the courts and congress are slow while children grow fast. Many were deported under duress without their children and have not had their asylum cases reopened. This week 29 of those parents are once again following international protocol and presenting themselves for asylum.

Please assure me that you will readmit and reunite these parents you have so grievously wronged.

I am very proud to be a US resident and a large part of that derives from our respect for human rights.
