Dear Mr President:

I am concerned about democracy. The antipathy of both elected and appointed Republicans toward voting has been clear for years including the Bush-Gore court ruling, moves to unregister voters (eg Kansas and Georgia), lifetime disenfranchisement after convictions (eg Florida) and a dozen voter id. laws.
