Dear Mr President:

I am concerned about terrorism. The guarantee of free speech means little when violent threats are tolerated. You encouraged violence during your campaign noting the need for a bit more after an attack at your rally in Fayetteville, noted very fine people were associated with the killing of Heather Heyer, called up troops to attack people in Washington and Portland, lionized a couple for making violent threats in St. Louis and called asylees and protesters threats to the country. In response terror groups heavily armed through the second amendment are encouraged to help out with vigilante militias terrorizing people near the border and dozens of recent showdowns including one in Portland in the wake of DHS, a campaign event for Mr Gilbert in Tyler and the murders in Kenosha of Anthony Huber and Joseph Rosenbaum.

Please assure me that you will renounce political violence.

I am very proud to be a US resident and a large part of that derives from our peaceful regime changes.
