Dear Mr President:

I am concerned about justice.

Writs of habeas corpus predate the Magna Carta where, as in the US constitution, they appear as a universal right, fundamental to individual liberty. The US immigration court system has long been problematic with little right to representation and subject to whims of the executive branch in which it is housed. The right to challenge the legality of being jailed though has been upheld and helps limit otherwise arbitrary detention. Your immoral and illegal unannounced deportation flights have tried to undermine any opportunity for prisoners to challenge their custody. Your Deputy Chief of Staff Miller reports that you are looking to further subvert the constitution with a full suspension of this ancient right.

My pride in the US derives in part from our constitutional rights.
