Instructions for Midterm 1

The first midterm will be on Monday, April 20. It will cover sections 2.1, 2.3, 2.4 and 3.1-3.6 of the book.

Please read these instructions very carefully.

0. Do not forget to sign the Code of Academic Conduct before the exam and upload to Gradescope. If you do not submit it, your midterm will not be graded.
1. You cannot use notes, books, calculators, phone or the Internet during the exam. You are not allowed to communicate with anyone about the exam problems. Find a room where you can stay for 2 hours with nobody disturbing you, make arrangements with your family and roommates well in advance. This is very similar to in-class exams.
2. There will be many different variants of the exam with slightly different problems. If you submit someone else's problems instead of your variant, your exam will be annuled.
