# Syllabus for MAT 280, Spring 2018

### **Course Description**

The course is focused on the construction of Khovanov homology, a powerful invariant of knots and links. It was used by Rasmussen to give a combinatorial proof of celebrated Milnor conjecture about the four-genus of torus links.
